A-Line Waist Silhouette

Empire Waist Silhouette

High waisted gown that extends from the bustline.

Great for:

- ✓ Pear-shaped brides to disguise hips

Sheath Silhouette

Form fitting silhouette from head to toe.

Great for:

- ✓ Lean brides
- ✓ Elongating short brides
- ✓ Casual intimate weddings

How to Save \$\$ on a Dress

- Try a lace trim instead of full lace

Dark Skin Tone -

Medium/Yellow Skin Tone -

Great for:

Basque Waist Silhouette

Mermaid Silhouette

Fitted gown that flares at the knees.

Great for:

- ✓ Showing off curves
- ✓ Slender brides
